We are gearing up for the 2021 AMA Flat Track Grand Championships at the Du Quoin State Fairgrounds in Du Quoin, IL and I wanted to give you some information to help clarify the race format for the week in order to make things go smoothly.

Let's start with the classes. I know you have seen me talk about Group 1 and Group 2 and I know many of you don't know the difference so here are the different Groups.

The days where we are running "Both Groups", that means Group 1 and Group 2. We will only be running the AMA Vintage Dirt Track National Championship classes on the Mile on Thursday, July 15th.

The schedule for the event is as follows :

Wednesday, July 14th, 2021 – Early registration from 3pm – 6pm

Thursday, July 15th, 2021 – Group 2 and Vintage National Classes on the Mile

Friday, July 16th, 2021 – Group 1 and Group 2 on the TT

Saturday, July 17th, 2021 is an OFF day for the AMA FTGC (* AFT Pro racers will be racing on the Mile)

Sunday, July 18th, 2021 – Group 1 and Group 2 on the Indoor Short Track

Monday, July 19th, 2021 – Group 1 and Group 2 on the Half Mile

Tuesday, July 20th, 2021 – Group 1 on the Half Mile

Supplemental Rules / Regulations for 2021 AMA Flat Track Grand Championships

1. The 2021 AMA Flat Track Grand Championships is an AMA National Championship Event sanctioned by the American Motorcyclist Association and these Supplemental Regulations are used to explain and clarify certain requirements and procedures.
2. If one or more main events cannot be run, results will be awarded based on heat and/or semi results.
3. Limit of four classes per rider per meet.
4. Knobby tires may be permitted by the Event Referee for the 50cc Production classes.
5. The use of a maximum 17-inch rear wheel for all 85cc classes in dirt track, TT scrambles and any 85cc Production class is permitted.
6. AMA Flat Track Grand Championships:
 - a. The points scale shown below will be used.
 - b. Riders who are disqualified from a main event will not receive points.
 - c. Ties in the final standings will be broken for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places only. The first tiebreaker is the better finish in the final main event in the class; the second tiebreaker is the better finish in the next to last main event in the class, etc. If the main events are run in an order different than originally scheduled, e.g. because of a rain delay, the actual order in which the races took place will apply.
7. The machine brought to the starting line for his/her first heat is considered the qualified machine for that day's meet.
8. Participants must have a valid Competition Plus, Competition Standard, or Youth membership to race in any of the AMA Flat Track Grand Championships classes.
9. Section 3.3 C.6. – 2021 AMA Racing rulebook: To participate in a Main event, the rider must start all heat and semi events, as required, for the class. If a rider is unable to compete in their heat or semi events due to a mechanical issue – they must present their motorcycle and themselves in full gear at pit out and inform the Chief Pit Steward they are presenting for their heat race and unable to race if they wish to transfer to the next race (semi or main).
10. Riders that qualify for a main event do not need to report to the staging line if they are unable to race the main event. They have already qualified and will receive last place points based on the number of participants in the event. Example: 8 rider main event: rider unable to participate will receive 8th place finishing points. If more than one rider is unable to start, their points will be based on the main event qualifying position.
11. Protests will be accepted up to 30 minutes after race results have been posted. The Event Referee may hold a protest until the completion of the Overall Championship Event.
12. Motorcycles that are impounded must remain in the impound area until the Event Referee allows for their removal. Motorcycles may be impounded for any length of time pending protests and/or appeals. If the motorcycle is being ridden in another class, it must remain in the designated impound area and all work done must be completed within this designated area.

13. On tracks one half mile and larger, abrasion resistant out gear is required. Abrasion resistant equals leather, Cordura, air mesh or stretch Kevlar. Exceptions may be made for 50cc Shaft riders but only by authority of the Event Referee.

14. All riders participating in the 2021 AMA Flat Track Grand Championships event(s) must have rider medical insurance.

INCLEMENT WEATHER: Any meet not run due to weather, or any other delay, may be run that day. The promoter reserves the right to change schedules and venues as necessary. If a meet is cancelled, it may be necessary to replace the discipline specific meet (i.e. Short Track) with another discipline specific meet, (i.e. Half Mile).

Event Championship Points will be awarded as follows:

1 st Place -	30 points
2 nd Place -	25 points
3 rd Place -	21 points
4 th Place -	18 points
5 th Place -	16 points
6 th Place -	15 points
7 th Place -	14 points
8 th Place -	13 points
9 th Place -	12 points
10 th Place -	11 points
11 th Place -	10 points
12 th Place -	9 points
13 th Place -	8 points
14 th Place -	7 points



Additional race requirements:

Treat all workers with respect. Remember they are here working long hours to give you a place to race.

1. No cussing or foul language.
2. No fighting. This is a family friendly event.
3. No alcohol or drugs!
4. Do not go into someone else's pit area. With COVID restrictions this is especially important.
5. No children on bicycles, scooters, pit bikes, Groms, golf carts, etc. We have repeatedly seen children create short tracks anywhere they can around the grounds. And they are not riding from point A to point B – they are riding around just for something to do. We will allow adults to use pit bike transportation because we understand that some people may have a more difficult time getting around. First gear, low speed, both wheels on the ground at all times. (A child can be a passenger with an adult.) Thank you for your cooperation.
6. No camping in the pit area. There is a great campground at the fairgrounds. All camping is on a first come first serve basis. They do not take reservations. Any questions, contact the fairgrounds at (618)542-1515.
7. No fireworks.
8. Please supervise your children.
9. No open fires.
10. A pit pass is required at all times.
11. Please keep your dogs on a leash. Dogs are not to be tied out - a person must be holding the other end of the leash at all times.
12. Please try to maintain social distancing. We want to be able to race and we all need to do our part.

A violation of these requirements can directly affect the racer that the violator is associated with in the form of AMA card probation or suspension or loss of racing privileges.
