CURRENT

B. Emergency Response Plan

1. Organizers will need to submit an Emergency Response Plan application that meets the criteria of this Policy. In all cases, the Emergency Response Plan must provide emergency services and transportation services to an appropriate acute care medical facility that exceeds the requirement of having an onsite ambulance.
2. The Emergency Response Plan must provide minimally Basic Life support in transport vehicles and preferably Advanced Life Support services. The hospital or trauma center must be capable of Advanced Life Support.
3. Medical Transport Vehicles should be available to transport within a 15-minute period.
4. The Emergency Response plan must provide on-site care that meets or exceeds the state requirements of on-site ambulance.
5. Criteria for Emergency Response Plan include:
 - a. There are no ambulance entities available to cover (NOT dependent upon cost)
 - b. The course is located in multiple ambulance jurisdictions.
6. The Emergency Response Plan must address Medical Helicopter response and landing zone.
7. The Emergency Response Plan must meet the insurance requirements of the meet.
8. The organizer must submit an annual Emergency Response Plan to the AMA offices for approval. The plan must be submitted 60 days in advance of the event. The plan must be approved by the AMA offices and with the Insurance Provider. The AMA will consult the Medical and Safety Commission to assist in the review for approval.
9. The approved Emergency Response Plan must be posted at registration day of the meet.

PROPOSED (Proposed changes in **bold**)

B. Emergency Response Plan

1. Organizers will need to submit an Emergency Response Plan application that meets the criteria of this Policy. In all cases, the Emergency Response Plan must provide emergency services and transportation services to an appropriate acute care medical facility that exceeds the requirement of having an onsite ambulance.
2. The Emergency Response Plan must provide minimally Basic Life support in transport vehicles and preferably Advanced Life Support services. The hospital or trauma center must be capable of Advanced Life Support.

3. Medical Transport Vehicles should be available to transport within a 15-minute period.
4. The Emergency Response plan must provide on-site care that meets or exceeds the state requirements of on-site ambulance. **This includes EMT or Paramedic certification in all the skills for level of provider. The provider must have the equipment required to carry out all the skills listed on the National Registry for either EMT or Paramedic which ever level they are certified for.**
5. Criteria for Emergency Response Plan include:
 - a. There are no ambulance entities available to cover (NOT dependent upon cost)
 - b. The course is located in multiple ambulance jurisdictions.
6. The Emergency Response Plan must address Medical Helicopter response and landing zone.
- 7. The Emergency Response Plan must describe the onsite treatment area that will be used to provide for patient protection and privacy.**
8. The Emergency Response Plan must meet the insurance requirements of the meet.
9. The organizer must submit an annual Emergency Response Plan to the AMA offices for approval. The plan must be submitted 60 days in advance of the event. The plan must be approved by the AMA offices and with the Insurance Provider. The AMA will consult the Medical and Safety Commission to assist in the review for approval.
10. The approved Emergency Response Plan must be posted at registration day of the meet.

REASON

Complete transparency on the use of the Alternative Ambulance Plan. It is very hard and at times impossible to get ambulance coverage in certain rural areas. The ability to legally transport falls onto jurisdictions assigned by states, all of which vary. There is wait time involved with ambulance transportation depending on the state jurisdiction statutes. In many cases, EMTs and Paramedics that are well versed and experienced with racing provide a higher level of care and bring knowledge with them that local emergency response providers do not possess.
