SC-1021-01: Youth vs Minor terms

Current

- 1.1.I. Youth Riders & Eligibility.
- 2.1.E. Youth Riders & Eligibility.
- 3.1.D. Youth Riders & Eligibility.

Proposed

- 1.1.I. Minor Riders & Eligibility.
- 2.1.E. Minor Riders & Eligibility.
- 3.1.D. Minor Riders & Eligibility.

Also review other uses of “youth” in the rulebook and determine whether “minor” is more appropriate.

Reason

Rules assigned to ‘youth’ participants actually apply to all ‘minor’ participants, whether they compete in ‘youth’ classes or ‘amateur’ classes.

I believe that references to ‘youth’ and ‘amateur’ participants in the rulebook is confusing to new AMA members, because 12-15-year-old minors may compete in an 85cc ‘youth’ class as well as a 250cc ‘amateur’ class at the same meet.

Back in the 1980s, a rider could not compete as both a “youth” and an “amateur” at the same meet. Those days are long gone.

 Merge 2.3.B (Youth - General Rules of the Meet) into 2.3.A (General Rules of the Meet).
 Merge 3.3.B (Youth - General Rules of the Meet) into 3.3.A (General Rules of the Meet).

Each of these rules are common sense enough that they should apply to all classes, not only the classes designated as "Youth" classes.

Current

- 1.3.J.1. All sanctioned motocross and youth meets are claiming meets.
- 2.3.F.1. All sanctioned meets are claiming meets.
- 3.3.H.1. All sanctioned Flat Track, Short Track, TT, Hill climb, Road Race, and youth meets are claiming meets.

Proposed

- 1.3.J.1. All sanctioned meets are claiming meets.
- 2.3.F.1. All sanctioned meets are claiming meets.
- 3.3.H.1. All sanctioned meets are claiming meets.

Reason

For consistency.

Also, the current language means that Arenacross (1.1.C), Supercross (1.1.D), Snowcross (1.1.E), Ice Race (3.5), Drag Racing (3.3.K.), Supermoto (3.7), and Land Speed Racing (3.3.M. and 3.11) are not claiming meets, as these are not specifically listed above.

Reason

Example: Section 1.2.D is currently organized in the following order: Engines, Fuel, Transmission, Brakes, Wheels & Axles, Frame, Handlebars & Controls, Forks, Gas Tanks, Fenders, Chain Guards, Exhaust Systems, Tires, Number Plates, Electric Motorcycles.

It would be easier - especially for new AMA competitors - to use this section if these items were listed in alphabetical order: Brakes, Chain Guards, Electric Motorcycles, Engines, Exhaust Systems, Fuel, Fenders, Forks, Frame, Gas Tanks, Handlebars & Controls, Number Plates, Tires, Transmission, Wheels & Axles
